

Options for Screening At Home

This document was created for schools that provide remote instruction to students and use the Delta Math Rtl Program to identify and support students who might struggle to learn math.

Based on feedback from math consultants, coaches, administrators and teachers, two options were identified to screen students remotely. Either option can be used "as-is" or as a starting point for your instructional leaders to develop a plan that is efficient and effective to gather instructional data.

Option 1: Use paper screener

- **Print** the paper readiness screener to be picked up by a parent.
- Communicate to the parent why their child is being screened.
- Read the paper screening script to students using Zoom, or another virtual meeting tool.
- The parent returns the completed paper screener.
- Sign in as each student to inqwizit.oaisd.org, enter each answer and turn in the readiness screener.

Option 2: Use online readiness screener

- **Print** the timed-facts (*grades 1-4*), work paper (*grades 3-Algebra 1*) and student username and password to be picked up by a parent.
- Communicate to the parent why their child is being screened.
- Ask the parent to read the timed-facts screening script to student. (Grades 1-4 only)
- Ask the parent to score the timed facts and write the number correct at the bottom of each page. (Grades 1-4 only)
- Ask the parent to help their child sign in to inqwizit.oaisd.org and monitor their child during the online screening.
- Read the online script to students using Zoom, or another virtual meeting tool.
- Ask the parent to **click on the number correct** for the timed facts questions and **turn in** the readiness screener.
