

### **Fall Data Review**

Who? Teachers and interventionists from the <u>current</u> and <u>previous</u> grade levels.

### Why?

Protocol 1: To identify and validate unexpected performance data

- Which students should be rescreened to validate data for 3 or more readiness standards?
- Which students should complete a Quick Check to validate data for 1 or 2 readiness standards?

Protocol 2: To identify readiness standards and plan to begin tier 2 intervention with all students

• Which readiness standard(s) should we consider beginning tier 2 interventions with all students?

Protocol 3: To identify students and plan for small group tier 2 interventions

• Which readiness standards will we provide tier 2 intervention to small groups of students

Protocol 4: To identify readiness standards for the next grade level and plan additional tier 1 support

• Which readiness standards do we need to plan additional/different instruction to increase student readiness for the next grade level?

Protocol 5: To communicate individual student performance and action plans

• Which readiness standards do each student need additional tier 2 support to increase their readiness to learn grade level math standards?

### To identify and validate unexpected performance data

(ex. 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher and 4<sup>th</sup> grade readiness standards)

- 1. Click Course Overview
- 2. Click to choose each fall assessment
- 3. Click Generate Report to display all students and their performance for each readiness standard.
- 4. Identify students who performed unexpectedly.

To identify readiness standards and plan to begin tier 2 interventions with all students

(ex. 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher and 4<sup>th</sup> grade readiness standards)

- 1. Click Standard Summary
- **2.** Click **Generate Report** to display the percent of all students who performed below benchmark for each readiness standard.
- 3. List each readiness standard where 30% or more of the students performed below benchmark.

**4.** Begin the tier 2 intervention for each of the above readiness standards with all students.



### To identify students and plan for small group tier 2 interventions

(ex. 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher and 4<sup>th</sup> grade readiness standards)

#### 1. Click Intervention Group

#### 2. Click Generate Report

3. List a small group of students to receive tier 2 interventions, or print the Intervention Group report.

*Note:* Do not schedule students for tier 2 intervention groups who appear in the Intervention Group report and their unexpected performance was validated as "benchmark" using a Quick Check.



To identify readiness standards for the next grade level and plan additional tier 1 support

(ex. 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher and 5<sup>th</sup> grade readiness standards)

- 1. Ask the teachers of the next grade level for the readiness standard(s) where 30% or more of their students performed below benchmark.
- 2. Plan to provide additional tier 1 support for each readiness standard and use Quick Checks and Growth Charts to measure and monitor student readiness for the next year.

- 3. Consider analyzing last year's Tier 1/Core instruction
  - **a.** Open the KATM website and find your grade level math flipbook.
  - **b.** Find a readiness standard to be taught this year during your Tier 1/Core instruction. (*Ctrl F*)
  - c. Read the Kansas Flip for your selected standard to answer each question.
  - Q1. How are these strategies similar or different to how you have taught this standard in the past?
  - **Q2.** What is something new you might try this year?



### To Communicate Individual Student Performance and Action Plans

- 1. Click on Student Performance
- 2. Click to choose the fall assessment. (Do not include more than one course.)
- 3. Click Generate Report to display a summary of all student performance for each readiness standard.
- 4. Choose a student report to support the discussion of the following:
  - > The purpose of the fall grade level readiness screener.
    - (To identify students who may not be ready to learn current grade level content standards.)
  - > The readiness standards for which the student met, or exceeded the benchmark.
  - > The plan to provide Tier 2 intervention for each readiness standard the student did not meet benchmark.
